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SECTION A

Q.1 Answer the following in about 150 words each: 10x5=50

(a) "I found the crown of France lying on the ground, and I picked it up with my sword." Explain Abraham Lincoln's perspective. [10 Marks]

Q.1 (b) “The end of the Second World War witnessed the development and growth of socialist forces in different parts of the world.” Discuss with the help of examples. [10 Marks]

Q.1 (c) “The great failing of the peace settlement was that it left the Germans with a sense of resentment and grievance but did not leave them too weak to retaliate and seek revenge.” Explain. [10 Marks]

Q.1 (d) Briefly discuss the Windrush generation and recent controversy associated with it. [10 Marks]

Q.1 (e) "A war with France lay in the logic of history."-Bismarck. Comment. [10 Marks]

Q.2 (a) “The path to socialism proceeds not through the establishment of model communities that set examples of harmonious cooperation to the world but through the clash of social classes.” Discuss the Marx’s critique of the utopian socialism and his attempt to put socialism on a new footing. [20 Marks]

Q.2 (b) "Drafting of the American Constitution was the work of four months of secret debates and compromises." Elucidate. [20 Marks]

Q.2 (c) Discuss how the frontal assault on the Enlightenment was launched by Jean-Jacques Rousseau. [10 Marks]

Q.3 (a) "The settlement reached at the Congress of Berlin had ignored the aspirations and sentiments of the Balkan peoples in the in the interests of Powers and could not bring peace in Europe in the long run." Analyse. [20 Marks]

Q.3 (b) “Vladimir Lenin statues had been recently pulled down in Tripura by mobs which clearly shows how opinions had been sharply divided about Lenin and he remains a controversial figure in the history.” Critically discuss different views regarding Lenin's controversial personality among historians and his responsibility of the excesses and atrocities during the Stalin era. [20 Marks]

Q.3 (c) "If Piedmont would gather to itself all living forces of Italy and will be in a position to lead her to the high destiny to which she is called Piedmont must begin by raising herself by re-establishing in Europe as well as in Italy a position and a credit equal to her ambition." Comment. [10 Marks]

Q.4 (a) What were the factors responsible for the rapid industrialisation Germany after 1870? How did the industrialisation process of Germany differ from that of Britain? [20 Marks]

Q.4 (b) Give logic for and against the view that Hitler had no clear long-term plans for a major War. [20 Marks]

Q.4 (c) "The Concert of Europe as an agency for international co-operation broke up mainly on two rocks, one principle and the other of the mutual jealousy of the Powers." Comment. [10 Marks]

(a) "Russia's defeat by Japan in 1905 had fatal consequences for the peace of Europe leading to the First World War." Comment. [10 Marks]

Q.5 (b) "Mussolini tried to solve Italian problem through the concept of Corporatism." Critically comment. [10 Marks]

Q.5 (c) "The Brussels Treaty was the first step towards the formation of NATO." Comment. [10 Marks]

Q.5 (d) “I believe that it must be the policy of the United States to support free peoples who are resisting attempted subjugation by armed minorities or by outside pressures. I believe that we must assist free peoples to work out their own destinies in their own way. I believe that our help should be primarily through economic and financial aid which is essential to economic stability and orderly political processes.”—President Harry Truman. Comment. [10 Marks]
